

# Timeline of the Archbishop Borders School History:

1873

Redemptorist Fathers lay the foundation of the present Sacred Heart parish on the corners of Foster and Highland Avenues, near the former Fort Marshall, the Civil War site

School Sisters of Notre Dame join the Sacred Heart Parish and begin educating students on this campus

1876

1916

Over 1,000 students are enrolled at Sacred Heart School

School on Highland and Fleet was completed

1923

1932

New school, in our current building on Highland and Foster, was completed

Pope Pius XII bestows a special Apostolic Benediction upon the School Sisters of Notre Dame for their Diamond Jubilee-- 75 years of educating students at Sacred Heart School

1951

1990

St. Brigid School and Sacred Heart School merged, becoming Bishop John Neumann School on the campus of Sacred Heart of Jesus

Archbishop Borders School opens as a community school at the site of Our Lady of Pompei, when it OLP and St. Elizabeth's School merged

2002

2010

ABS partnered with Boston College and began the Two-Way Immersion Network for Catholic Schools, when it launched its dual-language program in English in Spanish

Archbishop Borders School moved to the Sacred Heart campus
